

Crochet course supplies

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Essential tools:

- **3mm, 5mm & 10mm** crochet hook
- Scissors (an embroidery scissors works the best, normal scissors are also fine)
- (Cotton) yarn for a 3mm and 5mm crochet hook. Recommended for 3mm: **Scheepjes Catona** or **Cotton from Sostrene Grene**. Recommended for 5mm: **Katia Ekos** or **Drops Paris**
- Chunky yarn for a 10mm hook. Recommended: **Katia Wow Chunky** or **Hoooked Zpaghetti**
- Darning needle
- Stitch markers

Where to find crochet hooks:

Be sure to get a **3mm, 5mm and 10mm crochet hook**

If you're really into crocheting, I advise you to invest in a good quality or ergonomic crochet hook, especially in the size 3 and 5. Recommended: Addi Swing or Clover Soft Touch. Just buy the sizes you need (no package). But if you don't want to invest a lot of money, a regular crochet hook also works :).

A guide to different crochet hooks


There are different sizes of crochet hooks. Those different sizes fit the different weights and types of yarn (explained later). Sizes range from 0.5mm (which is very small) to 12mm (or even bigger) if considered in metric size. For U.S. size, a different designation is used (see figure applied below). For beginners, it's easier to start with a larger hook. As a beginner, I started with a 5mm crochet hook. But once you get more comfortable with crocheting, it is fun to switch around with hooksizes. So smaller or even bigger. There are lots of different materials for crochet hooks: steel, wood, bamboo, iron or aluminium. It differs from person to person what kind of hook they prefer. Once you start to develop in this hobby, you will feel what kind of hook you might prefer. I recommend starting with an iron or aluminium crochet hook.

A guide to different types and weights of yarns:

There are two different categories of yarn: natural types of yarn and synthetic types of yarn. Synthetic types of yarn are man-made. I would recommend working in natural kinds of yarn, which are lighter and more breathable. Natural yarns include wool (sheep and merino), alpaca, mohair, cotton and more. The most used synthetic type of yarn is acrylic.

The weight of the yarn decides what kind of crochet hook to use. It is important to know the weight of the yarn. The weight of the yarn can be described as how thick the yarn is. It explains the density of the strings the yarn is made up of. We will start by using medium weight yarn, which is also called worsted or aran. For this course, we use different weights of yarn. We use **fine/light yarn** for the 3mm hook, **cotton worsted weight (medium/aran) yarn** for the 5mm hook and **bulky-super bulky/chunky yarn** for the 10mm hook.
